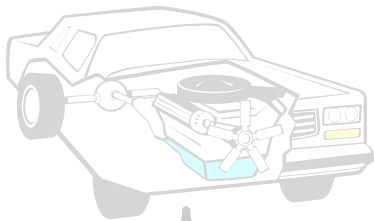

Bible readings and discussion questions  
for digging deeper into the sermon this week.

## In your Bible this week:

1. Many C@C people are reading through the Bible utilizing the Life Journal which lists daily readings in Old and New Testament each day. Life Journals are available at the info booth for \$5.00. Get yours and start reading through your Bible this week.
2. In addition or instead of your Life Journal readings, to dig deeper into the sermon teaching from this week: Read the whole Sermon on the Mount, Matthew 5-7 in one setting. Read it in different versions on different days. If Jesus is sketching out what it means to follow Him in this sermon, what kind of a life would that mean for you? Can you pick out the engine of, the inner spiritual life? What are the indicators of the condition of a person's inner spiritual life?

## Discussion questions for processing the sermon with your disciple buddy or small group:

1. When you're asked the question, "How's your spiritual life?" what is your answer?
2. How is your spiritual life different from the rest of your life? Is it different?
3. If Bible reading, prayer, church, giving, etc., make up the inner engine of your spiritual life; and your thoughts, attitudes, words and actions are indicators of your inner spiritual health, — what are the primary indicators in your life that your inner spiritual condition is in need of repair? What are the primary indicators that your inner spiritual condition is thriving?
