Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement)	7th month, Tishri 10	Sept/Oct
Tabernacles	7th month, Tishri 15-21	Sept/Oct
(Hanukkah)	10th month, 25 Kislev	December)

Special Assignment for Rosh Hashanah/Yom Kippur

1. Make a list of all the sins you committed over this past year. You can do it in code or whatever. Make this list on a sheet of paper you can bring to the Sunset Yom Kippur celebration next Sunday night, September 27.
2. Read and ponder the 10 commandments each day, Exodus 19:16-19; 20:1-26.
3. Preparing for the Day of Atonement, the people of God would "humble their souls," (NASV), "deny themselves," (NIV), "afflict their souls," (NKJV). This is typically understood to fast from food and refrain from work. Consider what you will fast (abstain) from on the Day of Atonement, Sunday, September 27, until the sunset service that night. Suggestion: To really feel the pinch of self denial, how about abstaining from TV, computer, cell phone for that day!!!
4. In the Old Testament, when a person became aware of their sins, they took a select animal from their herd to the Temple, there to sacrifice it to pay for their sin. If you were to bring the most valuable thing you possess to the Temple to sacrifice in payment for your sin, what would you bring. Write that at the bottom of your sin list.
