Study one of these passages each day to deepen the impact of the sermon in your life. Each session of pondering God's word will be like a spiritual meal and will nurture your soul for the day's challenges.

Day 3 Ezekiel 38:1-39:29.

Discussion questions for processing the sermon with your disciple buddy or small group. Why not grab someone and use these questions to discuss the sermon in the Gathering Center after church?

1. Describe what happened when you put your faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. Read Ephesians 2:1-6. Now think back through when you were saved and describe your experience in light of these verses from Ephesians.
2. Describe when you were baptized. Read Romans 6:4. Now describe what happened at your baptism in light of that verse. By the way, if you haven't been baptized by immersion, as described in Romans, you'll soon have an opportunity to do so. Just mark the blue card that you're interested in baptism.

Conversation starters with non-Christian friends. Use your own words and don't be afraid that you won't have all the answers or feel pressure to 'close the deal.' Just raise some questions.

1. Have you heard the term, "born again?" What do you think it means? (Listen and repeat back what you're hearing. Probably lots of religious misconceptions.) What if being "born again" meant that the Spirit of God came to make you feel alive in a whole new way and empowered you to overcome some of your greatest difficulties. Would you be interested in that?
